
This Quick Start Guide will help you get started with your Android™ powered Touch Phone. The Ouick Start Guide offers information about the basic features and functions that you want to know or use right away after you turn on the phone for

the first time. 2. Inside the Box

3. Getting to Know the HTC Dream



4. Installing the SIM Card, Battery, and Storage Card Make sure your phone is turned off before installing the SIM

Make sure your phone is turned off before installing the SIM card, battery, and storage card. You also need to remove the back cover before you can install the battery and SIM card.

To remove the back cover

- Hold the phone sideways with the control buttons on the right.
- Slide the screen panel up to reveal the keyboard and the back cover release tab.
- **3.** Gently push down the release tab with your finger until the back cover disengages from the phone.




4. Pull the back cover out, then set it aside.

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
To install the SIM card

- Locate the SIM card slot, then insert the SIM card with its gold contacts facing down and its cutoff corner facing out the card slot.
- 2. Slide the SIM card completely into the slot.



To install the battery

- Align the battery's exposed copper contacts with the battery connectors inside the battery compartment.
- Insert the contact side of the battery first then gently push the battery into place.
- 3. Replace the back cover.



To install the storage card

- Hold the phone sideways with the control buttons on the right.
- Open the keyboard, then locate the storage card slot at the side of the control buttons.
- 3. Pry open the storage card slot cover.
- Insert the microSD card into the slot with its golden contacts facing down until it clicks in place.



5. Replace the storage card slot cover.

Note Make sure that both ends of the cover are properly seated on the slot. The phone will not detect the storage card when the slot cover is not properly replaced.

5. Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you start using your phone, it is recommended that you install and charge the battery.

To charge the battery

- 1. Flip open the USB connector cover at the bottom panel of your phone.
- Insert the USB connector of the AC adapter to the USB connector on your phone.
- Plug in the AC adapter to an electrical outlet to start charging the battery. The Notification LED shows a solid green light when the battery is fully charged.

6. Starting Up

After installing your SIM card and battery and charging the battery, you can now power on and start using your phone.


Turn on the power

Press the END CALL/POWER button. The Home screen displays.

Note To turn off the power press and hold the END CALL/POWER button for a few seconds. When the Phone options menu appears, touch Power off. and then touch OK.

7. Home Screen

The Home screen is your starting point for using the applications on your phone. You can customize the Home screen to display application icons, shortcuts, folders, and widgets according to your preference.



Tip While in any application, press HOME to display the Home screen.

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To go to the left and right side of the extended

Home screen

The Home screen extends beyond the screen width to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more. Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to go to the left or right side of the extended Home screen.



Tip While on an extended Home screen, press HOME to return to the center Home screen.

To learn how to customize the Home screen, refer to the "Phone Basics" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

8. Getting Around Your Phone

There are different ways to navigate around the Home screen, menus and application screens on your phone.

Touch

When you want to select items onscreen such as application and settings icons, or press onscreen buttons, simply touch them with your finger.

Touch and hold

To open the available options for an item (for example, contact or link in a web page), simply touch and hold the item.

Swipe or slide

To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

Drag

Touch and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to drag. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.

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Flick

Flicking the screen is similar to swiping, except that you need to swipe your finger in light, quicker strokes. This finger gesture is always in a vertical direction, such as when flicking the contacts or message list.

Rotate

For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by opening the keyboard.

Use the TRACKBALL

You can use the TRACKBALL to select or highlight items on the screen.

Search button

Press the Search key (to search information on the current screen (e.g. Home screen) or application (e.g. Browser). For example, while in Browser, press SEARCH to launch Google™ search and search information on the web.

9. Accessing Device Applications and Settings

The **Applications** tab holds all pre-installed applications on your phone. This tab will also hold the icons of applications that you download and install from Android Market

To open the Applications tab

On the Applications tab:

- Touch an icon to open the related application.
- Scroll up/down on the tab using your finger or the TRACKBALL to view more applications.

Note To hide the Applications tab, touch or press the BACK button.

For complete information about applications that are pre-installed on your phone, refer to the User Manual PDF.

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Settings

Control and customize phone settings from the **Settings** screen.

To open the Settings screen

- On any application screen, press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings.
- On the Home screen, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Settings.

For complete information about the settings on your phone, consult the User Manual PDF.



10. Creating a Google Account and Signing In

The first time you access a Google service such as Google Talk™, Gmail™, or Android Market™, you will be prompted to create a Google account or sign in to your existing Google account (could be a Google Mail or Gmail account).

- Read the set up information on the screen and then touch Next
- 2. Touch Create

Note If you have an existing Google account, touch Sign in. Use the keyboard to enter your user name and password, and then touch Sign in. Your Google account email messages, calendar events, and contacts will automatically synchronize with your phone.

- Open the keyboard, and then enter your name and account user name, and then touch Next. Follow screen instructions to create your Google account.
- **4.** The phone synchronizes with your Google account. Touch **Finish setup**.

Retrieve your Google account password

Do these if you forgot your Google account password:

- 1. On your computer, open your browser and go to http://google.com.
- 2. On the upper-right side of the web page, click **Sign in**.
- 3. On the right side of the page, click I cannot access my
- In the Please select your issue section, select I forgot my password.
- Click Reset your password now, and then follow the procedure on how to recover your password.

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The following sections in this Quick Start Guide will show you how to use basic phone functions including how to make a call, enter information, send text and email messages, and more.

11. Making Your First Call

To place a call

- Press the CALL () button to open the dialer.
- **2.** Dial the number or contact you want to call, and then press .

As you touch the keys on the numeric keypad, the screen will display matches found on your phone and call log based on the keys you have touched.

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Tip During a call, press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN button on the left panel of the phone to adjust the in-call volume.

To check missed calls

When you have missed calls, you will see the missed call icon (
in the status bar. To check who the caller was, touch and hold the status bar, and then drag your finger downward on the screen to open the notifications panel.

12. Adding Contacts

Contacts gives you quick and easy access to people you frequently communicate with.

To open Contacts

Press HOME, and then touch Contacts.

To add a new contact

When you open Contacts for the first time, you are presented with options on how you can easily import your contacts into your phone.



To add a new contact on the phone

- 1. In the Contacts tab, touch Create new contact.
- Open the keyboard and then enter the contact's name and contact information such as mobile phone number, home phone number, or email address. Roll the TRACKBALL up or down to move among fields.



When finished, scroll down to the bottom of the screen and touch **Done**.

To import contacts from the SIM card

- In the Contacts tab, touch Import SIM contacts.
- 2. Do any of the following:
 - To import a contact, touch the contact you want to import.
 - To import all contacts, press MENU, and then touch import all.



If you use Microsoft® Office Outlook® or Windows Address Book (Outlook Express) on your PC, you can synchronize your contacts with your phone.

To synchronize, you need to install HTC Sync™ on your PC. You can find the installer in the microSD card that is included in the box or you can download it from www.htc.com/www/support.aspx.

13. Entering Information

Open and use the QWERTY keyboard to enter information on your phone.

To use the keyboard

- Hold your phone sideways, with the control buttons on the right.
- Push the screen panel up to reveal the keyboard.
- **3.** To enter text, simply press the keys on the keyboard.



Note The screen automatically changes to landscape orientation when you open the keyboard, except in Browser and Pictures, where you can set the screen orientation depending on your preference.

For more information about using the keyboard, creating application shortcuts, and adjusting the text settings, refer to the "Entering Text" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

14. Basic Settings

Customize your phone settings to suit your personal needs.

Adjust the volume

- While on any screen or application (except during a call, when playing music, or watching a video), press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN button on the left panel of the phone to adjust the ringer volume.
 - Tip While in the lowest ringer volume level, press VOLUME DOWN once to set your phone to Vibrate mode. While in Vibrate mode, press VOLUME DOWN once to mute the speaker of your phone.
- While playing music or watching a video, press the VOLUME UP or VOLUME DOWN button on the left panel of the phone to adjust the media volume.

Change the ring tone

- 1. Press HOME > MENU, and then touch **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Sound & display > Phone ringtone.
- 3. Select the ring tone you want to use, and then touch OK.

Change the Home screen wallpaper

- 1. Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Wallpaper.
- 2. Touch Wallpaper gallery.

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Select the wallpaper you want to use, and then touch Set wallpaper.

Tip You can also use a picture that you have stored in the storage card as the Home screen wallpaper. For more information about customizing the Home screen wallpaper, refer to the "Phone Basics" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

Enable SIM card PIN

- Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings.
- Touch Security > Set up SIM card lock, and then select the Lock SIM card option.
- 3. Enter the default SIM card PIN, and then touch OK.

Note Emergency calls can be placed at any time, without requiring a PIN

Lock the screen

Locking the screen turns off the display and disables the control buttons to prevent accidental screen touches and button presses.

Lock the screen by pressing the END CALL/POWER button.
To unlock the screen and enable the control buttons, press
MENU twice

To create and enable a screen unlock pattern

In addition to locking the screen, you can create and enable a screen unlock pattern. You have to draw the correct unlock pattern on the screen before you can unlock the screen and buttons.

- Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings.
- 2. Touch Security > Set unlock pattern.
- 3. Read the information on the screen, and then touch Next.
- 4. Study the example pattern on the screen, and then touch
- Draw the screen unlock pattern by connecting at least four dots in a vertical, horizontal and/or diagonal direction. Lift your finger from the screen when finished.

Next

Note You must slide your finger on the screen to create the pattern and not touch individual dots.

The phone records the pattern.
 Touch Continue, draw the screen unlock pattern again, and then touch Confirm



Change display settings

Conserve battery power by adjusting the screen brightness and setting a shorter idle time before the screen turns off.

To adjust the screen brightness

- Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings.
- 2. Touch Sound & display > Brightness.
- Drag the brightness slider to the left or right to decrease or increase the screen brightness, and then touch OK.

To adjust the time before the screen turns off

After a period of inactivity, the phone screen turns off to conserve battery power. You can set the idle time before the screen turns off.

- 1. Press HOME > MENU, and then touch **Settings**.
- Touch Sound & display.
- 3. Scroll down the screen, and then touch Screen timeout.
- 4. Select the time before the screen turns off.

Tip To turn off the screen quickly, press the END CALL/POWER button.

Change language settings


You can change the language of your phone's operating system.

- 1. Press HOME > MENU
- Touch Settings > Locale & text > Select locale.
- 3. Select the language you want to use.

15. Sending a Text Message

Easily create and send text messages (SMS) from your phone.

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Messaging > New message.
- Open the keyboard, then enter the mobile phone number of the message recipient in the To field.
- Roll the TRACKBALL down to select the text box, and then start composing your message.
- **4.** Touch **Send** or press \leftarrow to send the text message.



16. Sending a Multimedia Message

Create and send multimedia messages (MMS) that contain pictures, slideshows, or audio clips.

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Messaging > New message.
- Open the keyboard, and then enter the mobile phone number or email address of the message recipient in the To field.
- Press [min], touch Add subject, and then enter your message subject.
- Roll the TRACKBALL down to select the text box, and then enter your message.
- 5. Press [una], touch Attach, and then select a message attachment on the menu. You can attach a picture from the storage card, a new picture captured by the phone's camera, an audio file, an audio recording, or a picture slideshow.
- **6.** After selecting or creating the attachment, touch **Send** or press to send the multimedia message.

17. Using Wi-Fi

You can use Wi-Fi to connect your phone to the Internet if you have access to a wireless network.

To connect to an open Wi-Fi network

- Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings > Wireless controls.
- Select the Wi-Fi check box to turn Wi-Fi on and scan available wireless networks.
- Touch Wi-Fi settings. The network names and security settings (Open network or Secured with WEP) of detected wireless networks will be displayed.
- Select an open network to connect.

To learn how to connect to a secured network, refer to the "Getting Connected" chapter in the User



18. Sending Email Messages

Use **Gmail/Google Mail** to send and receive email messages on your phone.

Note If you have not set up a Google account, you will be prompted to create a new one or sign in to an existing account before you can use Gmail/Google Mail.

To create and send an email

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Gmail/Google Mail.
- 2. Press MENU, and then touch Compose.
- Open the keyboard, then enter the email address of the message recipient in the To field.
- **4.** Enter the email subject, and then compose your message.



Touch Send.

For more information about setting up other email accounts and an Exchange ActiveSync® account, refer to the "Exchanging Messages" chapter on the User Manual PDF.

19. Surfing the Web

Experience desktop-like web surfing when browsing the Internet.

To go to a web page

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Browser.
- 2. Press MENU, and then touch Go.
- 3. Open the keyboard, and then enter the web page address.
- 4. Touch Go or press

To search information in Browser

- 1. On the Browser screen, press [wind], and then touch **Search** to launch the Google search.
- 2. Enter the search word and then press SEARCH again.

For more information about Browser, refer to the "Getting Connected" chapter on the User Manual PDF.

20. Using YouTube™

YouTube™ is an online video streaming service that allows you to search and view videos which have been uploaded by YouTube members

Note Make sure you have an active data (GPRS/3G) or Wi-Fi connection before you open YouTube.

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch YouTube. The YouTube screen appears with the videos grouped into categories, such as Featured, Most popular, Most viewed, and Top rated.
- Touch a video category to display the videos within.
- **3.** Touch a video to play it on the screen.

Note The screen automatically switches to landscape orientation when you play a video.



To upload a video, press MENU, and then touch **Upload**.

Note You need to be signed in to your Google account to upload videos to YouTube.

21. Bluetooth

Connect your phone to a Bluetooth stereo headset for handsfree phone conversations.

To connect your phone with a Bluetooth stereo headset

- Make sure that both your phone and the Bluetooth stereo headset are turned on and within close range, and that the headset is visible. Refer to the manufacturer's documentation to find out how to set the headset in visible mode.
- On your phone, press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings.
- Touch Wireless controls, then select the Bluetooth check box to turn Bluetooth on and scan for Bluetooth phones within range.
- **4.** Touch **Bluetooth settings**, then select the headset in the Bluetooth phones section to start pairing.
- 5. When the Bluetooth headset is connected to your phone, the Bluetooth connected icon () will appear in the status bar. You can now start using the headset to receive phone calls.

For more information about using Bluetooth, refer to the "Getting Connected" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

22. Managing Your Time

Use **Calendar** and **Alarm Clock** to create events and remind you of your upcoming appointments.

To create an event

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Calendar.
- 2. Press MENU and touch New event.
- **3.** Open the keyboard and enter the event name.
- Specify the event time, location, description, and the calendar to store the event.
- Set the event reminder time, then select whether the event is recurring.
- 6. Touch Save.



If you have set up an event reminder time, the event notification icon (1) displays in the status bar when you have an upcoming event.

Touch and hold the status bar, slide your finger down the screen to open the notifications panel, and then select the event. You are given the option to snooze or dismiss the reminder.

To set an alarm

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Alarm Clock.
- 2. Touch a default alarm on the screen.
- 3. Select the Alarm check box to turn the alarm on.
- Touch Time to set the alarm time, and then touch Set when finished.
- Touch Ringtone to select the alarm ring tone, and then select Vibrate if you want the phone to vibrate when the alarm goes off.
- 6. Touch Repeat if you want the alarm to repeat.
- 7. Touch Label to set a name for the alarm.
- Press BACK to set the alarm and return to the Alarm Clock screen.


23. Taking Pictures and Capturing Video

Use the built-in 3.2 megapixel camera of your phone to take pictures or shoot video.

Note Install a storage card before you use the Camera.

To take pictures

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch
 Camera
- 2. Frame your subject on the screen.
- 3. Press the TRACKBALL or the CAPTURE button.



After taking the shot, you are given the option to save, delete, send, or assign the picture.

Refer to the User Manual PDF to learn more about Camera and how to capture video.

24. Copying Multimedia Files to Your Phone

- Before using **Gallery** or **Music**, copy pictures, music, and videos to the storage card installed on your phone.
 - Connect the phone to the computer using the USB cable.
 A notification icon appears in the status bar.
 - Open the notifications panel (by touching and then dragging the status bar down).
 - In the notifications panel, touch USB connected, and then touch Mount.
 Note When the phone is mounted, you will not be able to use some

of the phone's applications such as Camera. You need to turn off USB storage for the phone to recognize the storage card when the phone is connected to a computer. Refer to the User Manual for details.

- 4. On your computer, navigate to the USB drive and open it.
- 5. Copy your media files into the phone's storage card.
- **6.** Disconnect the phone from the computer.

25. Listening to Music

After you copied music files to the storage card, launch **Music** to play back music on your phone.

To play music

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Music. The Music library screen opens.
- **2.** Touch a music category.
- Touch and hold an item (a song, artist, album, or playlist) to open the options menu, and then touch Play.

The playback screen opens and plays your music.



For more information about Music, refer to the "Camera, Multimedia, and Documents" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

26. Viewing Pictures and Videos

After you copied pictures and videos to the storage card, or after you captured a photo or video using Camera, open **Gallery** to view them.

To view pictures or play videos

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Gallery.
- 2. On the Gallery screen, touch an album.
- Touch the file you want to view or play back.
- While viewing a picture in full screen, press MENU to edit, send, or view a slideshow of all pictures in the album.



For more information about Gallery, refer to the "Camera, Multimedia, and Documents" chapter in the User Manual PDF.

27. Uploading Pictures to Picasa

Upload pictures from your phone to your Picasa™ Web Album.

Note You need to be signed in to a Google account to upload pictures to Picasa.

To upload a picture to Picasa

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Gallery.
- 2. Locate the picture you want to upload to Picasa.
- 3. Touch the picture to view it in full screen.
- 4. Press MENU and then touch Share > Picasa.
- Enter a Caption for the picture and then select the Album where to upload the picture.
 - Tip Touch + to create a new album where you can upload the picture.
- Touch Upload.

28. Synchronizing Google Applications

Google applications on your phone, such as Gmail/Google Mail, Calendar, and Contacts, give you access to the same personal information that you add, view, and edit using Gmail/ Google Mail or Calendar on the web.

Note You need to be signed in to a Google account to synchronize Google applications.

To select which applications to synchronize

You can control data synchronization by selecting which applications to sync with those on the web.

- Press HOME > MENU, and then touch Settings > Data synchronization > Data synchronization
- Select the Background data and Auto-sync check boxes and then select the Google applications check boxes you want to be automatically synchronized.
 - Tip Clear the **Background data** check box to help save battery power and to lower data connection usage.

Note If the Auto-sync check box is not selected, you need to touch the Google application in the list to synchronize it.

29. Downloading Applications from Android Market

Android Market is a place where you can download applications and games to your phone.

Note You need to have an active data (GPRS/3G) or Wi-Fi connection before you can download and install an application.

To download and install an application

- Press HOME, touch the Applications tab, and then touch Market.
 - Touch a featured application on top of the screen to open the application details screen.
 - Tip You can also touch Applications or Games to view and select applications in a categorized list. Touch an application in the list to open its details screen.
 - Touch Install. After the application is downloaded and installed on your phone, the content download icon () appears in the notification area of the status bar.
 - 4. On the Android Market screen, touch My downloads.
- Touch the installed application in the list, and then touch Open.

30. Resetting the Phone

Resetting the phone deletes all data, including downloaded applications, and resets the phone back to its initial state—the state before you turned on the phone for the first time.

Important

Make sure to back up all important data you have on the phone before you perform a factory data reset.

To perform a factory data reset

- 1. Press HOME > MENU, and then touch **Settings**.
- Scroll down the screen, and then touch SD card & phone storage.
- Navigate to the Internal phone storage section, and then touch Factory data reset.
- On the Factory data reset screen, touch Reset phone and then touch Erase everything.


