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

1 Check it out!

- 1 Camera lens**
Lens for taking pictures.
- 2 Camera release key** 
Press and hold to quickly take pictures.
- 3 Infrared**
Use to exchange data with other compatible Nokia phones or your compatible PC.
- 4 Mini display**
View the clock and caller ID without opening your phone.
- 5 Main display**
- 6 Left and right selection keys** 
Press to access the option shown above the key.
Tip! When the phone is open, press the  key during a call and talk handsfree.
- 7 Volume key**
In the open or closed position, press up to increase the volume or down to decrease the volume.
- 8 4-way navigation key with center selection key** 
 - ▶ Activate the camera
 - ▶ View your contacts
 - ▶ Compose a message
 - ▶ Create a voice message
- 9 Talk and End keys** 
Press the Talk key to make a call or to answer an incoming call. Press the End key to end a call, or press and hold to return to the idle screen.
- 10 Power key** 
Press and hold to turn phone on or off.



2 Install the SIM card

 Your Nokia 6103 phone uses a convenient SIM card, which holds information about your wireless service and stores contact information. That means you can transfer your service and contacts to your phone simply by inserting your SIM card!

Insert the SIM card

1. With the back of the phone facing you, push down the release button on the back cover.
2. Slide the cover off in the direction shown (fig. 2.1).
3. After removing the battery, open the SIM card holder by pressing the release button and lifting the holder up (fig. 2.2).
4. Insert the SIM card with the gold-coloured contact area facing downwards and the bevelled edge pointing towards the top of the phone (fig. 2.3).
5. Close the SIM card holder.

3 Insert and charge the battery

Insert and charge the battery

1. Align the gold-coloured contacts of the battery with the battery compartment contacts. Press the battery into place (fig. 3.1).
2. Replace the back cover by aligning the tabs, then sliding the cover into place until it locks.
3. Plug the Nokia charger into a standard AC wall outlet (fig. 3.2).
4. Connect the charger cable to the bottom of the Nokia 6103 phone.
Tip! Allow the battery to fully charge before using your phone.
5. After your phone is fully charged, turn it on. You will be prompted to set the time and date.

Recharge the battery

Recharging time is approximately 90 minutes while the phone is in standby mode. While charging is in progress, the battery charge indicator scrolls on the phone display. It stops scrolling when the battery is fully charged.

4 Send an audio message

Personalize your multimedia messages in a spontaneous and creative way by sending voice messages. An audio message is easy to record and send, and it eliminates cumbersome voicemail systems.

Send an audio message*

1. From the Start screen, press the center selection key to open the **Menu**. ()
2. Scroll to and select **Audio message** (fig. 4.1). () () ()
3. Press **Select** to begin recording your audio message (fig. 4.2). ()
4. When you are finished recording, press **Select** (fig. 4.3). ()
Message ready for use displays.
5. Select **Send**. ()
6. Scroll to and select your sending option, such as **To phone number**. () ()
7. Enter the phone number, or select **Find** to locate it in your phone book (fig. 4.4). ()
8. Select **OK**. ()
Message being sent is displayed.



5 Take a picture and send it via MMS

The Nokia 6103 phone gives you the power to communicate visually. Use the integrated camera to snap still images or capture full-motion video clips with sound. See it all richly displayed on the high-colour, high-contrast screen.

Take a picture

1. From the Start screen, select the center selection key to open the **Menu**. ()
2. Scroll to and select **Media** (fig. 5.1). () () ()
3. Select **Camera** (fig. 5.2). ()
4. Aim the viewfinder at your subject and select **Capture**. ()
You will hear a "snap" as the camera takes the picture and saves it to the **Images** folder in the Gallery.

Tip! You can also access the camera in just one click by pressing the Camera release key. ()

Send a picture via multimedia messaging

1. After taking a picture, select **Send** (fig. 5.3). ()
Object added displays.
2. Type your message, then select **Send**. ()
3. Select a sending option, such as **To phone number**. ()
4. Type in the phone number or select **Find**. ()
5. Select **OK**. () **Message being sent** displays (fig. 5.4).



6 Pair with a Bluetooth headset

Bluetooth wireless technology lets you experience total mobility! Connect your Nokia 6103 phone to a headset with Bluetooth technology to talk without wires, connect to your PDA, compatible PC or printer, and create your own personal communications network.

Pair phone with a Nokia Bluetooth headset

NOTE: To ensure compatibility with other Bluetooth technology devices, check with their manufacturer.

1. Turn on your Nokia Bluetooth headset.
2. On your phone, Select **Menu**. ()
3. Scroll to and select **Settings** (fig. 6.1). () ()
4. Scroll to and select **Connectivity** (fig. 6.2). () ()
5. Select **Bluetooth** (fig. 6.3). ()
6. Scroll to and select **Search for audio enhancements** (fig. 6.4). () ()
7. Select **Yes** when prompted to turn Bluetooth on. ()
8. Select the headset device from the **Devices found** list. ()
9. Enter the passcode for your headset if prompted.
If you do not know the passcode, consult your headset product documentation.

The Nokia 6103 is compliant with Bluetooth Specification 1.2, SIM access profile, object push profile, file transfer profile, dial-up networking profile, headset profile, handsfree profile, generic access profile, serial port profile, and generic object exchange profile. To ensure compatibility with other Bluetooth devices, check with their manufacturer.
